

Revolutionary War Pension Application of Joel Stamper.

STAMPER, JOEL S12438 a pvt in Regt commanded by Col. Campbell in North Carolina line for 9 months, 21 days. Inscribed on Roll of North Carolina @ \$32.33 per annum commencing 4-Mar 1831.

Wilkes County, North Carolina Court of P & QS 4 Feb 1833 came Joel Stamper, aged 77 years and states he was born in Amherst County, Va, 17 May 1755 and at age 12 years removed with his father to Wilkes County, North Carolina. Ent as a Vol under Capt. Jesse Waltons Company of Minutemen, stationed at Salisbury for 3 months under Genl Rutherford and was discharged. Again ent at Salisbury for 3 months under Genl Rutherford and was discharged. Again ent under Genl Rutherford and marched to Cross Creek or Fayetteville where remained 2 months and returned home. Again ord out by Genl Rutherford in quest of Tories in Forks of Yadkin for three weeks. Again ord out by Col. Cleveland, marched to near Rutherford in Burke County and ord to Kings Mtn. Having no horse, sd Stamper did not reach battleground in time for battle. Marched with Tory prisoners to Salem, North Carolina where recd discharge; a tour of 3 months. Again to New River agst Tories for 3 weeks. No written evidence of service, but refers to statements of William Spicer, Joseph Pruitt and William Johnson.

Joel X Stamper

William Spicer, under oath, states he served in Rev War with Joel Stamper 3 mos tour to Salisbury, 2 mos to Cross Ck or Fayetteville and 3 weeks in forks Yadkin.

William X Spicer

Joseph Pruitt, upon oath, states he served in Rev War with Joel Stamper, two or three weeks agst Tories on New River.

William Johnson, upon oath, states he served in Rev War with Joel Stamper on Kings Mtn tour.
