

Keith, Philadelphia, 1883, details this: ANNE WILLING, dau. of Thomas and Anne (née McCall) Willing, last named, b. Phila., Aug. 1, 1764, d. Bermuda, May 11, 1801, m. Phila., Oct. 26, 1780, William Bingham, son of William Bingham, by his w. Mary Stamper, b. Phil., March 8, 1752, grad. A.B. (U. of P.) 1768. This rare book was obtained by my wife from Gilmore's Book Shop, 43 E. Chestnut Hill Ave., Philadelphia, PA 19118. The ancestry of Samuel Powel, the Patriot Mayor, is set forth in *The Morris Family of Philadelphia* by Robert C. Moon, M.D., 1898.

The current Mayor of Denver – John W. Hickenlooper – is a direct descendant of immigrant Anthony Morris through his mother who was a Morris. He came to Denver from Philadelphia. The current President of United Airlines is Glenn Tilton, a direct descendant of immigrant William Tilton.

When I was in law school at Westminster Law School (a night law school taught by practicing lawyers – regular course was four years instead of the traditional three years in day school), which merged with the University of Denver College of Law just before my senior year, my real estate professor was Charles Henry Haines, Jr. He was a senior partner of the law firm of Grant, Shafroth, Toll and McHendrie - did his undergraduate work at the University of Denver and got his law degree from the University of Michigan Law School. He ran for the Colorado House of Representatives (Rocky Mountain News, Wednesday, October 27, 1954, page 20). His father - born Grinnell, Iowa on June 19, 1877 – Charles Henry Haines, Sr., was an Assistant Denver City Attorney from 1940 through 1958, specializing from 1904 until 1958 in real estate, water and mining law; and taught real estate law and conflicts of interests at Westminster Law School for forty years. He handled the condemnation of the land that became the Buckley Field Bombing Range. His Quaker father was Robert Miller Haines of Grinnell, Iowa, where he did his undergraduate work at Grinnell College before going to Harvard Law School for his law degree. He had taught history and coached football at Grinnell Academy before going to Harvard Law School. He lived at 2201 South Fillmore Denver, Colorado, was a member of the University Park United Methodist Church, where Pamela Gay Stearns and I were married on June 6, 1964. He died at 105 years of age in 1982. Vide Rocky Mountain News, Sunday, July 25, 1982, page 21 and The Denver Post, Monday, June 20, 1977, page 14. At the time, I did not know when I was in law school we were related as descendants of Richard Haines who died 1682 on the ship "Amity." This was first pointed out to me in a letter dated July 15, 1975 from John W. Haines, author of *Richard Haines and His Descendants*, referred to supra. In the letter, he states: "One of our cousins, Charles H. Haines, was a lawyer in Denver before 1905. His wife, Nanaruth, was graduated from The University of Denver in 1900." Nanaruth Taggart who married Charles Henry Haines, Sr., was the Dean of Women at The University of Denver in 1905-06 (1903-04, Instructor in Latin and History; 1904-05, Professor of Oratory and Instructor in Latin; 1905-06, Professor of Oratory, Instructor in Latin; 1906-7, Professor of Oratory).
