Thomas Stamper; dated at Ocaoie on the S^o side of Hisspaniola, July 8, 1754; wife Rebecca Stamper; Elizabeth Stamper and Mary Pearson; witnesses, Alexander Tallifort and Henry Styles; administration to Rebecca Stamper, widow of Thomas Stamper, October 11, 1754.

JOHN PETER SPECHT of New Hanover Township, Philadelphia County; dated August 8, 1754; son Conrad Specht to provide for his mother and four sisters; youngest daughter Margaret Lis; other daughters Eve Mary, Eve Elizabeth and Elizabeth; mentioned god sons and god daughters; Ernst Slegels; witnesses, Conrad Geyer and John Tretakengst; administration to Conrad Specht son of Peter Specht, October 29, 1754, Catherine the widow having renounced the administration.

CHRISTOPHER MILLER, Philadelphia; dated November 30, 1752; mentioned wife Louisa; witnesses, Joh. Casp. Rubel, minister, at Philadelphia, Henry Bassler and John Jacob Heintz; administration to John Beeker who married Louise, widow of Christopher Miller, October 31, 1754, the widow having renounced the administration.
